Capacity Fees

- What are Capacity Fees?
 - One-time capital charges assessed against new development as a way to provide or cover a proportional share of the costs of capital facilities constructed or to be constructed for its use
 - Address equity concerns between current and future users
 - Commonly known as connection fees, capacity fees, system development charges, impact fees, etc.

 - Infrastructure needs







Potable Water (PW) Capacity Fees






Sanitation Capacity Fees

Capacity Fee Study: 2023

- District hired Raftelis Financial Consultants to update capacity fees
- Evaluated Capital Improvement Program (CIP)
- Potable Water, Reclaimed Water and Sanitation Service assets



Capacity Fee Calculation

- "Buy-In" Method
 - Recognizes that existing users have developed and maintained a system that can accommodate growth
- "Incremental Cost" Method
 - Focuses on growth portion of CIP and the cost of additional facilities needed to provide incremental growth
- "Hybrid" Method
 - Combination of "Buy-In" and "Incremental" Methods



Legal Requirements

CAPACITY FEES MUST:

- Reflect the link between fees and benefits received by new customers
- Not exceed the proportional share of costs associated with providing service

per **Assembly Bill ("AB") 1600** (codified as California Government Code §66000 – 66008) as well as §66013, 66016, 66022, and 66023



Implementation Details

- Publication of proposed capacity fees and 2023 Study
- Notification to developers, cities, LA County, engineering firms, contractors and the Building Industry Association of Southern California
- Notification via letter to customers with capacity fee deposits
- Notification to customers at the Engineering and Customer Service public counters
- Implementation target of July 1, 2024
