Mr. Pun responded that the supplementary information is not required to be audited because this audit is conducted by CalPERS auditors. He noted that GASB 68 net pension liability requires two schedules to be presented, including the total pension liability and the pension fiduciary net position, and the schedule of funding progress.

Director Polan referred to the Statement of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Position Operating Revenues - Other Income, which showed \$2.955 million for 2016 compared to \$1.9 million for 2015. He inquired regarding the approximately the \$1 million difference. Don Patterson, Director of Finance and Administration, responded that the revenue was primarily reimbursement from MWD for the Mow-No-Mow Program.

Director Caspary referred to the Condensed Statements of Net Position - Table 1, Other Liabilities, which showed \$15.6 million for Fiscal Year 2016 compared to \$13.1 million for Fiscal Year 2015. He inquired regarding the difference of approximately \$2.5. Mr. Pun responded that the difference included a combination of several current liabilities, including accounts payable, interest payable, and unearned capacity and developers fees.

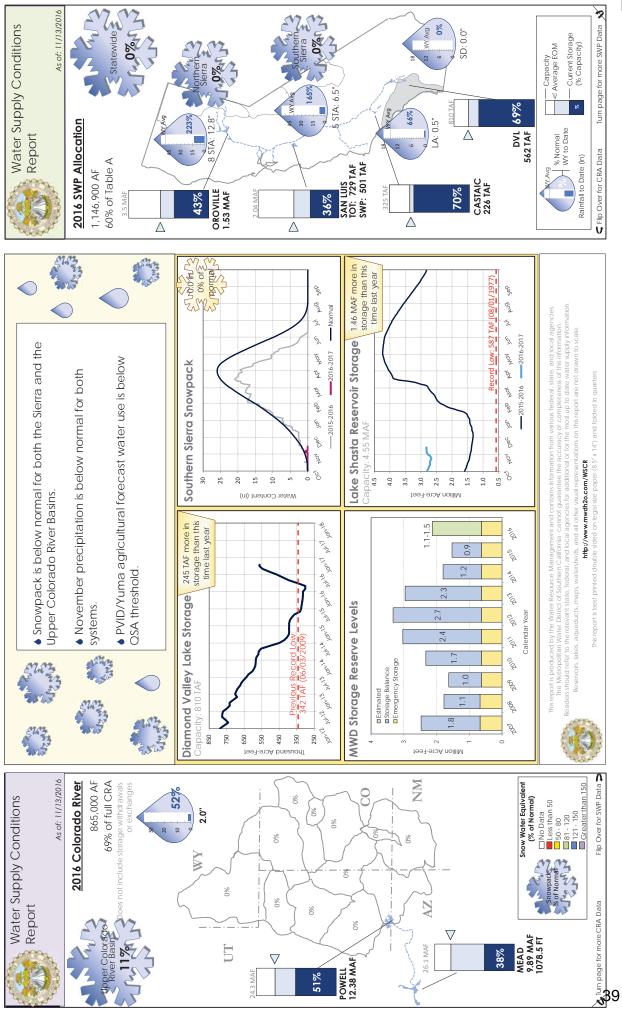

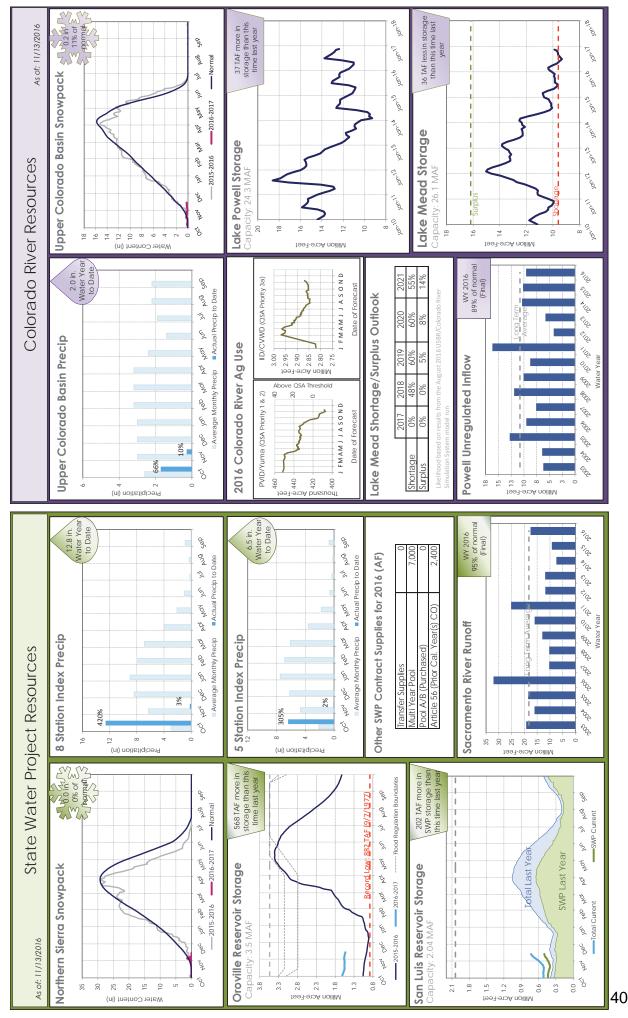

Subject: 2016 Capacity Fee Study: Framework Workshop No. 2

#### **SUMMARY:**

On July 12, 2016, staff and Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. (RFC) presented the Board with the proposed framework for the 2016 Capacity Fee Study. At the meeting, the Board provided staff and RFC with feedback on the methodologies to be used for determining the capacity fees. RFC incorporated the feedback and will present the Board with its preliminary findings. Additionally, staff reviewed the meter installation costs and will present its findings to ensure that these fees recover the actual, current costs.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

#### **ITEM BUDGETED:**

Yes

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

There is no financial impact associated with this item because the Board will not be taking action to adjust the fees at this time. However, a future agenda item is expected for adjustment of the capacity fees to ensure that new potable water system and sanitation customers pay their appropriate share the costs related to the additional demands on the systems.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The District's current potable water and sewer capacity fees were last modified in 2004. For reference, Attachment 1 provides the currently-adopted capacity fee schedule. On February 9, 2016, the Board approved an agreement with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc., (RFC) to evaluate and update the District's capacity fees. The goal of the capacity fee study is to

identify the financial resources required by the District to construct facilities to meet future needs and accommodate planned growth in the service area. Together, the recent updates to the District's master planning documents, development of the Infrastructure Investment Plan and completion of the 2015 Rate Study provide foundational information for the 2016 Capacity Fee Study.

The basic theory behind establishing capacity fees is relatively straight-forward. Future growth generates the need for new or larger capital facilities. The estimated cost of the new or larger facilities, along with a share of existing facilities, can be equated to a dollar per connection amount for the service (capacity fee). Each new development then pays a connection or capacity fee for the water and sewer services needed to support the proposed development. Currently, there is no fee for recycled water connections; however, a component of the potable water capacity fee is designated for recycled water infrastructure.

On July 12, 2016, staff and RFC provided the Board with an overview of the proposed capacity fee review process, reviewed current policy principles, and discussed methodologies for capturing the existing system and future costs related to growth. Significant direction from the July 12th workshop included: (1) using the "System Buy-In" method for sewer capacity fees; (2) using the "Hybrid" method for calculating potable water capacity fees; and (3) maintaining the common "postage stamp" capacity fee structure for different areas within the District, except for the sewer capacity fees applicable to areas of the District where the wastewater is normally conveyed to the City of Los Angeles.

RFC incorporated the Board's feedback and direction into its capacity fee model and will present its preliminary findings at the meeting. Additionally, staff compiled a list of prepaid capacity fee deposits and reviewed the District's current costs for meter installation, which consists of three components: (1) administration, (2) meter, and (3) installation. Attachment 2 is a technical memorandum that summarizes staff's findings related to prepaid capacity fee deposits and meter installation costs. Finally, staff reviewed and proposing several updates to the District's Policy Principles for Potable Water and Sewer Capacity Fees, which is included as Attachment 3.

Raftelis Financial Consultants was hired to update the Construction and Conservation components of the District's Potable Water Capacity Fees and its Sewer Capacity Fees. This memo provides information on:

- 1) Prepaid capacity fee deposits for planned Potable Water and Sewer services; and
- 2) Cost analysis and proposed adjustments to the Administration, Meter Cost and Installation cost components to the Potable Water Capacity Fees.

#### **Prepaid Capacity Fee Deposits**

Customers pay Capacity Fees for proposed connections sometimes months or years ahead of commencement of service for the property. The Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Capacity Fee schedule states "An Applicant shall pay Capacity Fees existent when service commences regardless of when the Capacity Fees are deposited / paid."

Table 1 details the number of Potable Water prepaid connections by meter size. Table 2 Identifies the Sewer Capacity Fees connections by equivalent residential unit (ERU).

#### PW Connection Fees: Cost Analysis of Administration, Meter and Installation Costs

The Potable Water Capacity Fees include Administration, Meter Cost, and Installation costs in addition to the Construction and Conservation cost components being studied by Raftelis Financial Consultants. For customers applying for potable service with 1" or smaller meter size, customers pay a fixed amount for the administration, meter and installation costs. Staff reviewed the actual costs for these categories for 2007 through 2016.

Table 5 and Table 6 show current and proposed fees based on review on historical costs. Also shown are the proposed Construction and Conservation fees (developed by Raftelis Financial Consultants) to provide a comparison of existing to proposed connection fees for this customer classification.

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# Potable Water Capacity Fees Sewer Capacity Fees Policy Principles

- 1. Existing customers have already paid their share of system costs to pay for establishment, expansion, or improvements in the water and sewer systems to accommodate new growth and needn't be burdened with costs of future expansions.
- 2. New customers creating new demand on systems should pay for their share of the existing system and incremental costs for expansions to service systems (water and/or sewer).
- 3. Future growth and population projections will be based on adopted General Plans, Specific Plans, and land use plans of the various land planning agencies (utilizing data and trends obtained from cities, county, Southern California Association of Governments, and U. S. Census).
- 4. Amounts of Potable Water and Sewer Capacity Fees (referred to as "Capacity Fees") will be based on the value of the existing system ("Buy-In Cost") and the capital improvement costs to expand and/or extend service facilities during the planning horizon for growth projections as determined by Master Plans and/or other studies (Incremental Cost).
- 5. Capacity Fees will be named and utilized as follows (consistent with Las Virgenes Code):
  - Potable water connections Potable Water Capacity Fee and funds will be utilized in the Potable Water Construction Fund. A component of this fee, the Water Conservation Fee, will be utilized in the Water Conservation Fund to constructor expand new recycled water facilities, and other water conservation programs.
  - Sewer connections Sanitation Capacity Fee and funds will be utilized in the Sanitation Construction Fund.
- 6. Potable Water Capacity Fees will be the same for the entire district water service area. Water Conservation Fees (connection fees for the recycled water system) will continue to be a component of the Potable Water Capacity Fee.
- 7. Sewer Capacity Fees will vary depending on service area. Properties in service areas U-1, U-2, and "D" will relate to improvements necessary at the Tapia WRF and Rancho Las Virgenes biosolids disposal facility. For other areas (U-3 and B) the connection fee will relate to the connection fee structure of the City of Los Angeles.
- 8. Capacity Fees will continue to be considered as deposits, consistent with existing Las Virgenes Code and the Connection Fee Deposit Agreements (executed by developers at the time connection fees are paid). Payment of the Fees assures a developer of rights to capacity in the district's water and/or sewer

systems. Adjustments. (up or down) will be made to the deposit if changes to the Potable Water or Sewer Capacity Fees are implemented by the district between the time the deposit is made and the district takes acceptance of the water and/or sewer system. Funds on deposit will accrue interest and be applied against future adjustment of fees that may be required. This change will be effective on the date the new Capacity Fees are implemented.

- 9. Potable Water and Sewer Capacity Fees may be annually updated utilizing the Construction Cost Index (CCI) as published in <u>Engineering News Record</u>. Capacity Fees may also be updated after major revisions to system master plans (water and/or sewer) and/or significant changes are made in Land Uses (such as "Granny Flats" or other mixed-use developments) in the district service areas.
- 10. Staff will advertise any proposed modification to capacity fees by contacting the Building Industry Association of Southern California and local media outlets.

Subject: Assessor Parcel No. 4461-008-022: Detachment Request

#### SUMMARY:

The owner of Assessor Parcel No. 4461-008-022 on Latigo Canyon Road at the District's southern border (see Attachment A) requested the parcel be detached from the District's service area and annexed to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29, Malibu (WWD No. 29) and West Basin Municipal Water District. The District's nearest water main is approximately 2,300 feet away from the property, and the rugged terrain and steep slopes on the property create significant difficulties to extend the District's existing water main.

WWD No. 29 has expressed a willingness to serve the property (see Attachment B), since it is currently serving another parcel within its service area just south of the subject property. Prior to initiating a request for detachment of the property from the District and annexation to WWD No. 29, the Local Agency Formation Commission of Los Angeles County (LAFCO) asked the District to approve the reorganization in concept. Completion of the detachment would still require final approval by the Board.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve in concept the detachment of APN No. 4461-008-022 from the District's service area.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Yes

#### **ITEM BUDGETED:**

No

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

The detachment would result in the loss of approximately \$270 per year in standby

charge revenue and any applicable connection fees and rate revenue.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

APN No. 4461-008-022 fronts Latigo Canyon Road within the District's service area at its southern border. The parcel is approximately 27 acres with a proposed building site located at the southern end of the property. The property is in a canyon adjacent to Latigo Canyon Road with steep slopes and rugged terrain on either side (see Attachment C).

The District's nearest potable water system facilities are at the cul-de-sac of Mar Vista Ridge Drive (see Attachment D). At this location, there is an elevation drop of approximately 35 feet from Mar Vista Drive to Latigo Canyon Road with a large retaining wall in between; therefore, a water main extension from Mar Vista Ridge Drive to Latigo Canyon Road is not feasible. Water service through a Limited Service Agreement (LSA) from Mar Vista Ridge Drive is also not possible because the proposed service line would need to cross two private parcels, and Los Angeles County Department of Regional Planning rules only allow private water service lines to cross one parcel.

Further, LSA service from District facilities at the southern end of Ocean View Drive is also not possible because the water service line would need to cross two private parcels and the public right-of-way. The next nearest District facilities are at the intersection of Ocean View Drive and Latigo Canyon Road, approximately 2,300 feet away. A main extension from this location would cost approximately \$506,000, based on \$220 per linear foot as estimated in the 2014 Potable Water Master Plan Update. Together, these factors present significant difficulties for a one-parcel development. Additionally, a long water main extension to serve one property would likely create water quality problems due to water stagnating at the end of the distribution system.

Staff visited the site and confirmed there is an existing WWD No. 29 meter serving 5656 Latigo Canyon, the property immediately south of the proposed building site for the subject detachment request.

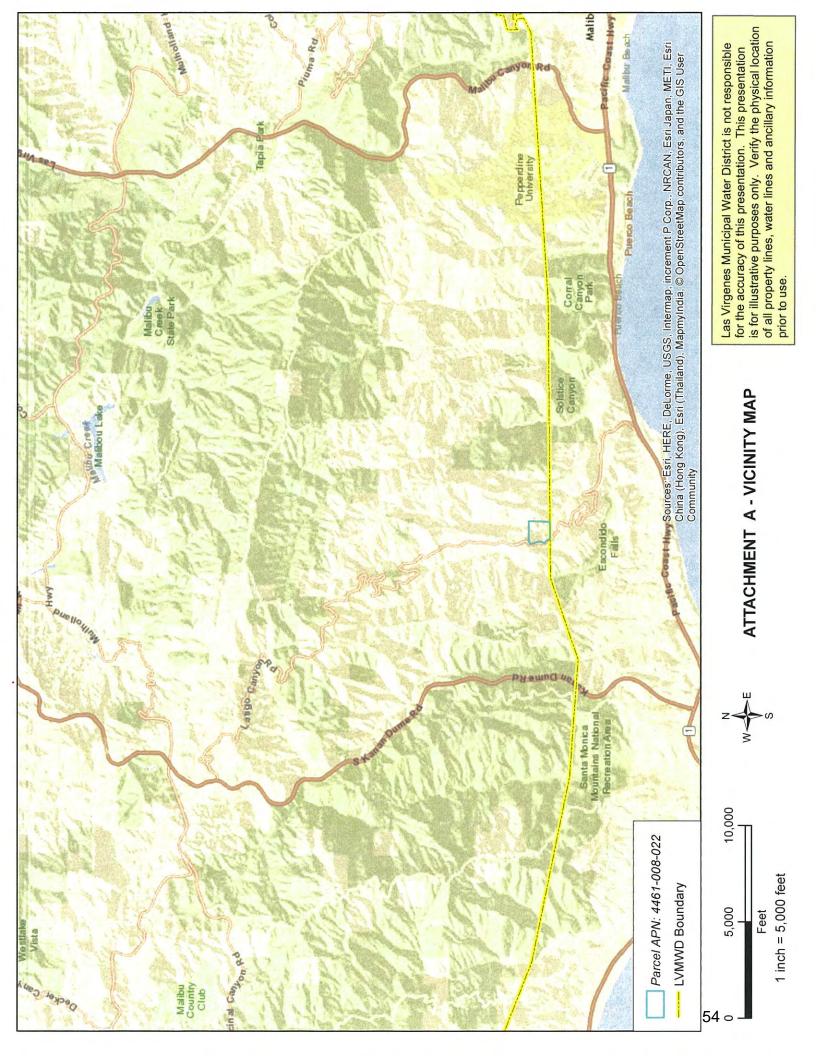

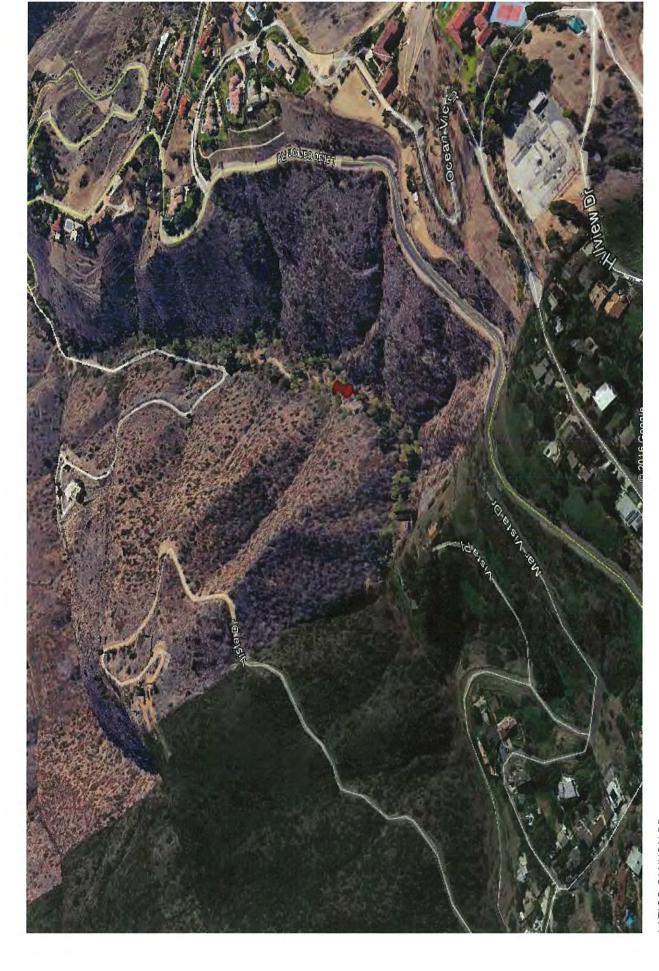

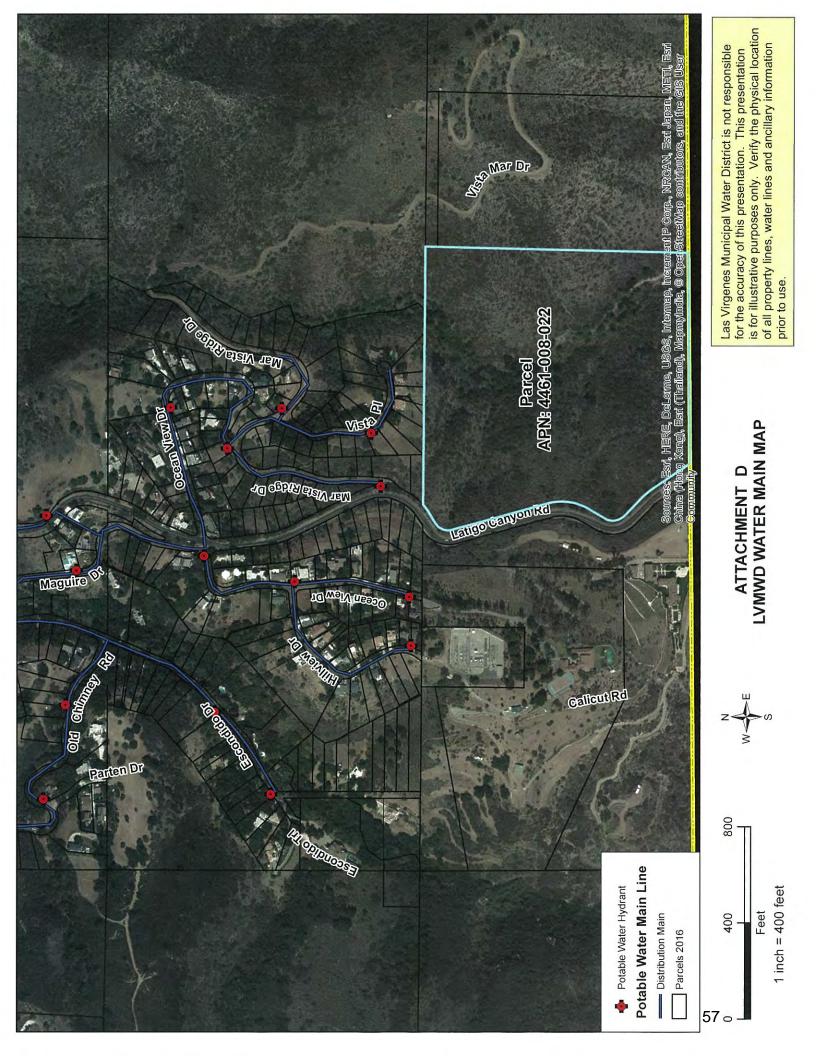

**Project: CEQA Determination and Call for Bids** 

#### **SUMMARY:**

The Las Virgenes Road Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 Rehabilitation Project consists of removing and replacing the pressure reducing valves and fittings for an underground pressure reducing station west of Las Virgenes Road, near the District's Headquarters. The equipment for the station has reached the end of its useful life and requires replacement.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Find that the work is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act and authorize a Call for Bids for the Las Virgenes Road Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 Rehabilitation Project.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

No

#### **ITEM BUDGETED:**

Yes

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

There is no financial impact associated with the issuance of a Call for Bids.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 on Las Virgenes Road has reached the end of its useful life and requires rehabilitation that involves replacing the valves and fittings and re-establishing

the tie-in points with the existing pipe by excavating adjacent to the underground vault.

The facility is an underground pressure reducing station located within a landscaped area of the Malibu Canyon Villas Homeowners Association at 4265 Las Virgenes Road. The station reduces pressure from the 1235-foot zone to the 1000-foot zone and was constructed in 1985 as part of the housing tract. The valves and fittings have deteriorated with excessive corrosion due to the damp conditions in the vault. Given the location of the station and close proximity to homes, staff determined that it would not be feasible to reconstruct the station above ground for aesthetic reasons. To reduce the potential for future corrosion of the metallic components within the vault, the new pipe, fittings and valves are proposed to be fusion-bonded, epoxylined and coated, which would extend the design life of the new station with greater corrosion protection.

The work is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to Section 15301(a) of the CEQA Guidelines for minor alternations of existing facilities with negligible expansion of existing use.

Attached for reference are a Notice of Exemption, location map and photos of the facility.

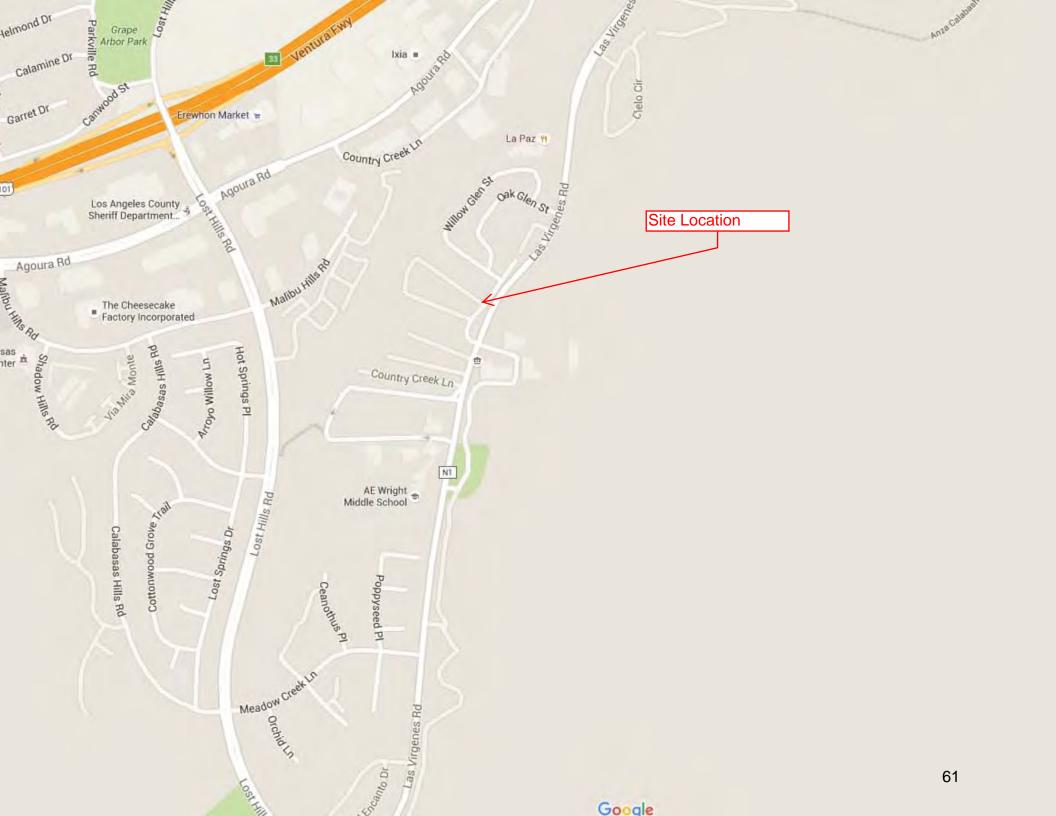

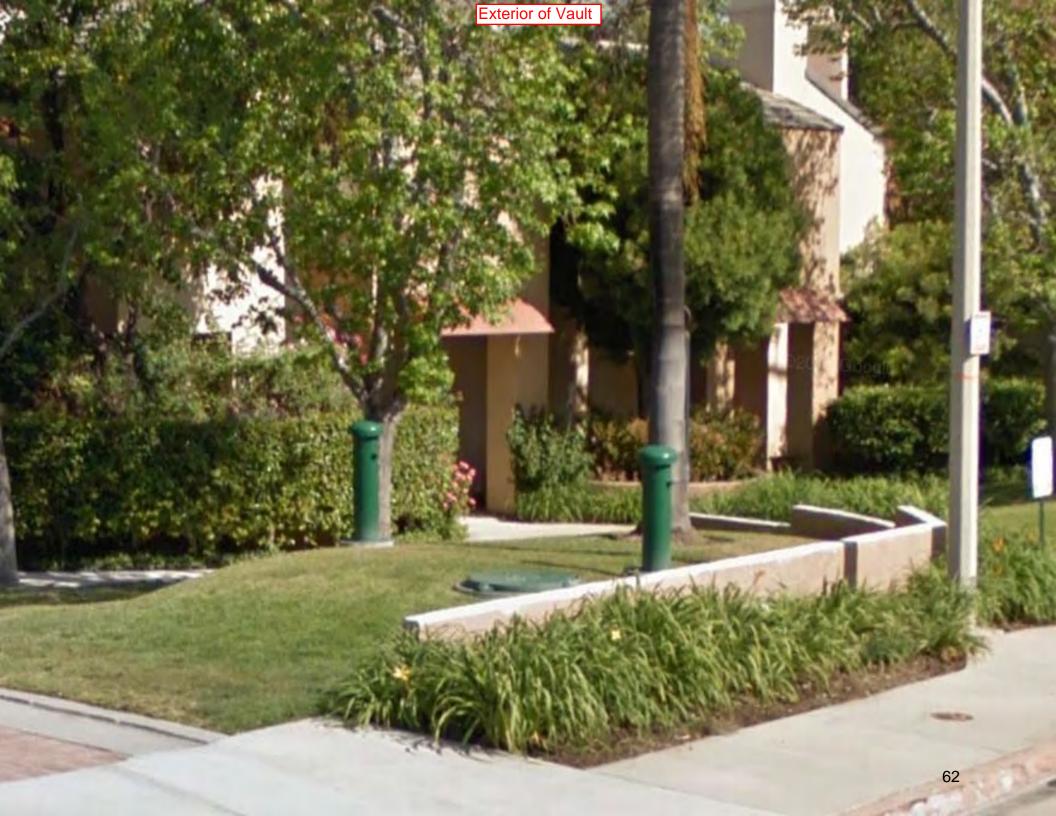

Subject: Headquarters Pavement Rehabilitation Project: Construction Award

#### **SUMMARY:**

On September 27, 2016, the Board authorized a call for bids for the Headquarters Pavement Rehabilitation Project to remove and replace localized asphalt and concrete failures, seal cracks, and slurry coat the entire asphalt area and drive aisles. A mandatory pre-bid walk was conducted on October 13, 2016. Four bids were submitted and publicly opened on October 27, 2016. Staff evaluated the bids and determined that the lowest responsive bid was submitted by Toro Enterprises, Inc., in the amount of \$117,704.60, which is approximately 26% lower than the Engineer's Estimate.

Staff recommends award of a construction contract to Toro Enterprises, Inc.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Award a construction contract to Toro Enterprises, Inc., in the amount of \$117,704.60, and reject all remaining bids upon receipt of duly executed contract documents for the Headquarters Pavement Rehabilitation Project.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The adopted Fiscal Year 2016-17 udget provides funding, under CIP Job No. 10609, in the amount of \$228,800. No additional appropriation is required.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The majority of the existing asphalt at the District's Headquarters is over 22 years old as it was installed in 1994 as a part of the Headquarters Building Expansion Project. Over time, the asphalt has been exposed to weather and heavy loading from District equipment. Understandably, the areas of most severe damage exist within the main drive aisle from the driveway at Las Virgenes Road to the maintenance and service area where the concrete ribbon gutter is damaged and the asphalt is failing.

This project will rehabilitate the Headquarters' parking and drive aisle areas by removing and replacing localized asphalt and concrete failures, crack sealing, slurry sealing, and repainting all curbs and asphalt striping.

Staff has communicated with the City of Calabasas to coordinate project scheduling because temporary closure of the dog park is required during construction activities. The construction would occur in phases to allow for normal District operations, provide sufficient parking for Board meetings, and maintain access for the public and staff.

The Engineer's Estimate for the construction work was \$160,000. The summary of bids is as follows:

**Subject: Janitorial Services: Contract Renewal** 

#### **SUMMARY:**

On September 9, 2014, the Board awarded a one-year contract, in the amount of \$61,568.52, with four one-year renewal options, to Commercial Cleaning Systems for District-wide janitorial services. The first renewal option was administratively approved last year by the General Manager, including a 9.8% increase in the annual amount due to changes in state law for employee benefits. Staff recommends the Board approve the second renewal option, including a 3.9% increase to reflect changes to the minimum wage for 2017.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Authorize the General Manager to execute the second one-year renewal option with Commercial Cleaning Systems, in the amount of \$70,197, for District-wide janitorial services.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Yes

#### **ITEM BUDGETED:**

Yes

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

Sufficient funds for the work are available in the adopted Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget. The annual cost will be \$70,197, which is a 3.9% increase over the current cost of \$67,562.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The District currently contracts with Commercial Cleaning Systems (CCS) for District-wide

janitorial services. CCS has agreed to a one-year contract renewal provided the District approves a 3.9% increase to account for a minimum wage increase for 2017. On January 1, 2017, the minimum wage will increase in California from \$10.00 per hour to \$10.50 per hour, a 5% increase. Subsequently, the minimum wage will increase annually until it reaches \$15.00 per hour in 2022.

Last year, the General Manager administratively approved the first one-year renewal option with CCS for janitorial services. The renewal amount included a 9.8% increase in the annual amount due to changes in state law requiring small companies to offer sick leave benefits to employees. The increase was within the General Manager's 10% approval authority; however, the increase proposed for the current year combined with the previous year increase exceeds the General Manager's authority and requires Board approval. Staff recommends approval of the second-year renewal option, recognizing the increased cost of labor for these services, and proposes to re-bid the contract next year.

Subject: Building No. 8 Server Room Improvement Project: Reject All Bids

#### **SUMMARY:**

On September 27, 2016, the Board authorized a call for bids for the Building No. 8 Server Room Improvement Project. The scope of work consists of expanding the existing server room to incorporate a server closet within a portion of the storage area on the second floor of the District's Headquarters. The project will provide protection of vital information systems equipment and data. The work includes the construction of a new server closet; LED lighting; redundant cooling to the server closet; computer racks; a redundant uninterruptable power supply system; and the installation of conduit, cabling and electrical wiring.

A mandatory pre-bid job walk was held on October 12, 2016 with five contractors in attendance. One bid was received and publically opened on October 26, 2016. The bid was submitted by A. Bates GC, Inc., in the amount of \$328,000. The bid is significantly higher than the Engineer's Estimate of \$150,000 and exceeds the budget for the project. Additionally, the single bid does not provide the District with a competitive process for bid evaluation.

As a result, staff recommends rejecting all bids and re-evaluating the scope of work to develop alternative options for the project such as the use of a self-contained data center. Staff will return to the Board with a revised scope of work and recommendation once the project alternatives have been evaluated.

#### RECOMMENDATION(S):

Reject all bids for the Building No. 8 Server Room Improvement Project.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact associated with the rejection of bids.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The proposed project as specified required multiple sub-contractors to provide services to the new server closet location. These specialty disciplines include HVAC, electrical, fire suppression and general carpentry, which add cost to the project due to contractor coordination and mark-up. Alternatively, staff intends to evaluate options to use the available space within the existing server room for a self-contained data center, which integrates the HVAC and fire suppression systems within a self-contained server box that should reduce the overall project cost and minimize annual electrical costs.

The self-contained data center would address the information systems needs without constructing a new data center space to store the equipment. The units provide data center grade thermal management, uninterruptable power supply, power management, monitoring and control technologies, cable management and fire suppression all in an enclosed system. Also, the units include configurations for future expansion, power and cooling redundancy levels and emergency ventilation.

Subject: Resolution of Intent for Continuation of Potable Water Standby Charge

#### **SUMMARY:**

The District proposes to continue its Potable Water Standby Charge to support its Potable Water Replacement Program (Program). Prior to Fiscal Year (FY) 1995-96, the Program was funded entirely through the District's potable water rate structure. However, in June 1995, the District implemented a "Standby Charge," pursuant to the Municipal Water District Law of 1911, to augment the Potable Water Replacement Fund with a steady source of alternate income. The Potable Water Standby Charge is assessed on both improved and vacant properties, recognizing that funded improvements benefit both current and future customers.

The Standby Charge has been renewed each year since FY 1995-96, and staff recommends its continuation for FY 2017-18. No change is proposed for the FY 2017-18 Standby Charge; it would continue to be ten dollars (\$10.00) per parcel per year for parcels of one acre and less, and ten dollars (\$10.00) per acre and each portion thereof per year for parcels greater than one acre.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Pass, approve and adopt the proposed Resolution of Intent for continuing the Standby Charge pursuant to the Municipal Water District Law of 1911; order notification for those properties that changed ownership since the last Standby Charge assessment; order publication of a Notice of Public Hearing in a newspaper of general circulation once a week for a two-week period; and set a public hearing on the matter for 5:00 p.m. on January 10, 2017.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

Continuation of the standby charge would generate approximately \$400,000 for Fiscal Year 2017-18.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

For the first three years of assessing the Standby Charge, the District notified all landowners within the District by postcard of the public hearing to initiate or continue the Standby Charge. In conjunction with the mass mailing, a notice of the time, place and purpose of the public hearing was published in a newspaper of general circulation once a week for a two-week period. As this procedure was followed for three consecutive years, state law allows for an alternative procedure to provide notification to only those properties that have changed ownership since the last Standby Charge assessment. The alternative procedure has been used since 1998 and is recommended for the FY 2017-18 notification. In addition, a publication of the Notice of Public Hearing will be placed in a newspaper of general circulation once a week for a two-week period.

A Standby Charge Deferral Program is available for property owners who receive little or no benefit from the District's water system. The deferral, once executed, remains in effect until:

- 1. The property owner receives a benefit from the District's water system;
- 2. The Standby Charge is discontinued; or
- 3. The property owner terminates the deferral in writing and pays the deferred charges due to the District for up to a 10-year maximum.

Staff recommends continuance of the Standby Charge to provide a fixed source of income that will supplement the Potable Water Replacement Fund and provide an equitable means of assessing existing and future customers for a portion of costs of replacing the potable water system.

On September 29, 2015, the Board approved a three-year agreement with Psomas to assist the District with administration of the Standby Charge. The work involves maintaining the tax database, which is submitted to Los Angeles County for the tax assessment, conducting necessary mailings and performing other program support.

# RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT INITATING PROCEEDINGS FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE WATER AVAILABILITY OR STANDBY CHARGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2017

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

#### **Section 1.** Purpose and Scope

This Resolution initiates proceedings to continue to levy a water standby charge for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2017, to finance water replacement programs of the District.

#### **Section 2.** Affected Lands

Lands within the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District service boundaries are affected by this Resolution.

#### Section 3. Proposed Charge

- (a) The proposed standby charge shall not exceed \$10.00 per acre per year or \$10.00 per parcel of less than one acre per year for each parcel of affected land.
- (b) It is also proposed that variances to the above charges be granted for unusual circumstances.

#### Section 4. Public Hearing

- (a) The Board shall conduct a public hearing at Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, 4232 Las Virgenes Road, Calabasas, California, on January 10, 2017, at the hour of 5:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, to consider the continuation of the standby charges described herein. The Board will hear and consider all objections or protests, if any, to the proposed charges.
- (b) The Notice of Public Hearing shall be in the form required by law. The notice shall be mailed at least twenty-one days prior to the date set for the hearing to each owner of land for which ownership has changed since the last standby assessment or availability charge was fixed as shown on the last equalized assessment roll, or known to the Secretary of the District. The notice shall also be published at least once a week for two weeks prior to the date set for the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published within the District, if there is one, and if not, then in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Los Angeles County.

#### **SUMMARY:**

On October 26, 2016, the District received the attached claim, in the amount of \$1,302.59, from David E. Brown of Calabasas for reimbursement of plumbing service expenses incurred on October 6 and 19, 2016. The claimant alleges that high water pressure to his home caused his sprinkler control valve to blow off on October 5th, requiring a plumber to install a pressure regulator.

Staff investigated the incident and found no evidence of pressure changes in the area of the claimant's home at the time. Staff recommends denial of the claim because the customer is responsible for the installation and maintenance of a pressure regulator to protect his customer-side plumbing system. Further, pursuant to the provisions of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code, the District is not responsible for damages caused by high water pressure and repairs downstream of the meter are the responsibility of the customer.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Deny the claim from David E. Brown

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact associated with denial of the claim.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

On the afternoon of October 5, 2016, the claimant saw water gushing from a pipe on his front lawn and called 9-1-1 after unsuccessfully attempting to turn the water off. The claimant was referred to the Los Angeles County Fire Department who responded and turned his water off. Subsequently, the claimant hired a plumber to complete the repairs and was told that the incident occurred due to high water pressure from the District's water system. The damages were limited to the claimant's front yard because his rear yard is protected with a pressure regulator.

Pursuant to the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code, customers are responsible for ensuring the safety of their property by installing adequate plumbing and protective devices in compliance with the Uniform Plumbing Code. The applicable sections of the Code are provided below for the Board's consideration.

#### 3-3.101 - GENERAL:

All applicants and customers shall accept such conditions of pressure and service as are provided by the distribution system of the district at the location of the proposed service connection, and hold the District harmless for any damage arising out of low pressure or high pressure conditions or interruptions in service.

#### 3-3.108 - PRESSURE, SUPPLY AND EMERGENCY STORAGE:

The District will exercise reasonable diligence and care to deliver a continuous and adequate supply of water to the customer at a reasonable constant pressure and to avoid any shortage or interruption in delivery. The District offers water at its system pressure, and the applicant must install adequate plumbing and protective devices in accordance with the current Uniform Plumbing Code in order to utilize the available water at whatever reasonable constant pressure is available in the system. The District is not responsible for the maintenance of pressure and reserves the right to discontinue service while making repairs required in the operation of the water system. Customers depending upon a continuous supply should provide for their own emergency storage.

#### 3-4.205 - DAMAGE TO PROPERTY:

(a) In no case will the District be liable for damages occasioned by water running from opened or faulty fixtures, or from opened or damaged pipes on the customer side of the meter.

On October 24, 2016, the District received the attached claim, in the amount of \$496.23, from Marc and Maria Rubel of Hidden Hills to reimburse them for the cost to replace their pool pump. The claimants experienced air in their water lines on the morning of October 9, 2016, due to District staff performing repairs to the water main on Jed Smith Road. The air allegedly dislodged and damaged the claimants' pool pump, which required replacement.

Staff investigated the incident and confirmed that work was performed on the water main serving the claimants' home at the approximate time of the damage to the pool pump. Given the circumstances, the General Manager opted to settle the claim, which was within his delegated authority as specified in the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code. Payment in the amount of \$496.23 was issued to Marc and Maria Rubel on November 15, 2016.

In the morning of Sunday, October 9 (approximately 8:00 a.m.), the flushing of the toilet in my master bathroom created a shaking and rattling that was so loud and violent that it woke my wife and tore the floating ball above the flapper off its setting. Not knowing what was going on, and wanting to be safe, I turned off the water line to the toilet.

Not wanting to risk any flooding or damage inside the house, I went outside and turned on the water to the pool and the tap that's used to clean out the pool equipment. Again, there was violent shaking, this time twice as loud, severely rattling the pool motor/pump. I immediately turned off the water. As I stood there wondering what was going on, I could hear construction noises coming from the street far below.

My property is a flag lot that is situated behind another property so the distance from the street is close to a hundred yards. I walked down my driveway to the street and saw a LVMWD crew working across the street (at 1515 Jed Smith Rd.), to fix a broken water main. I told one of the workers about what happened when I turned on the water a my house, and he explained that their repair work forced compressed air into the water main on our side of the street. He said we had water but the rush of air and all the air in the water pipes could really "shake things up."

Neighbors who live on the same side of the street as I do, had also walked over to talk to the repair crew. They reported that when they flushed a toilet, it shook so hard that the tank lid came flying off and that some of the inside parts shook loose.

I returned to my house just as my wife had turned on the kitchen sink faucet. The entire sink and counter shook and air blasted out of the faucet for a good thirty seconds before water appeared. We then carefully and slowly opened up the various water sources in the house; something we had to do for nearly three days until LVMWD had completed their repairs because air was still in all the water pipes.

Later that Sunday, I realized that my pool motor/pump had completely shutoff. I called my pool maintenance company and they sent a man out on Monday morning. He reported that the shaking had not only dislodged the setting of the pump motor but had seriously damaged it, its seals and gaskets, making it useless.

On Tuesday morning, I checked on the status of the repair and met a trio of LVMWD employees, including Larry Miller. Mr. Miller explained that the repair work was complete and confirmed that there had been a lot of air in the water pipes on our side of Jed Smith Road. When I told him about the damage that had occurred on my property he suggested that I file a claim. As you can see, I have included the "paid" receipt from the Pool Patrol company, in the amount of \$496.23. The part of the toilet that came loose, I was able to put back in place myself and could detect no other broken parts or damage.

I have lived at Jed Smith Road for 26 years and in all that time I have never filed a claim with Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, or any other utility server. I make mention of this because I do not take filing a claim as something frivolous.
