General Manager David Pedersen stated there was no update for Closed Session Item 13A, and he recommended that it be removed from the agenda.

<u>Director Caspary</u> moved to approve the agenda as amended. Motion seconded by <u>Director Polan</u>. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call vote.

5. ILLUSTRATIVE AND/OR VERBAL PRESENTATION AGENDA ITEMS

A 30-Year Service Award: Director Glen Peterson

Director Caspary presented a certificate and service award pin to Board President Peterson in recognition of his 30 years of faithful and dedicated service to the District.

Board President Peterson thanked the Board and staff, and stated that it has been an honor to serve on the Board of Directors.

Director Renger commended Board President Peterson on his service.

The Board recessed to a break at 5:08 p.m. and reconvened at 5:16 p.m.

B Legislative and Regulatory Updates

General Manager David Pedersen reported that the State Water Resources Control Board would be holding a public workshop on January 18, 2017, to receive input on the Emergency Regulations for Urban Water Conservation. He stated that staff would submit a comment letter requesting that the regulations be allowed to expire without further extension, and that the self-certification process be maintained and utilized in the future if necessary. He also reported that the State Water Resources Control Board is requesting comments by January 26, 2017, for the proposed Basin Plan Amendment for the TMDL Implementation Plan. He stated that staff would prepare a comment letter in support of the plan without changes. He reviewed the California Senate Committee assignments and the California Assembly Leadership Team and Committee Chairs assignments. He noted that newly elected Senator Henry Stern opened his office in Calabasas and his staff includes District Director Nancy Farias and Field Representative Jeremy Wolf. He also reviewed the key provisions of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act, Senate Bill 612.

C Water Supply Conditions and Drought Response

General Manager David Pedersen noted that a handout was provided showing the most recent changes in water supply conditions and hydrology; the current weather forecast; the Northern Sierra precipitation 8-station index showing 41.9 inches; the San Joaquin precipitation 5-station index showing 30.8 inches; the statewide summary of snow water content; and the current reservoir conditions. He stated that the District achieved a 28.8 percent reduction in water usage for the month of December as compared to 2013, and reduced water usage of 19 percent for calendar year 2016, as compared to 2013.

District Counsel Keith Lemieux read Ordinance No. 279 by title only.

B Information Systems Disaster Recovery and Backup Services

Accept the proposal from Denovo Ventures, LLC, and authorize the General Manager to execute a three-year agreement, in the annual amount of \$55,104, for disaster recovery services; and accept the quotation for Unitrends, Inc. through CDW, and authorize the General Manager to execute a one-year agreement, in the amount of \$28,980, for could-based backup services.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

Director Polan moved to approve Item 8B. Motion seconded by Director Renger.

Director Polan inquired regarding the District's vulnerability to hacking. Harold Matthews, Information Systems Manager, responded that if a determined party wishes to hack into the District's system it would be difficult to stop them and all that could be done would be to recover the District's files quickly. Director Polan inquired which data would be backed up and protected. Mr. Matthews responded that Denovo would back up the data in the District's Financial System and Customer Information System, and Unitrends would back up the District's servers.

Motion carried unanimously upon roll call vote.

DISCUSSION:

The District utilizes the State of California's Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) for a significant portion of its investment portfolio to maintain liquidity. The District's Investment Policy, adopted by the Board on July 26, 2016, requires a minimum of six months of operating funds, currently approximately \$23.7 million, to be in readily available funds, such as LAIF.

Staff recently reviewed the District's 2004 resolution, authorizing representatives to administer the LAIF account, and compared it to current best practices related to internal controls and how other public agencies authorize LAIF signers. Based on the review, staff recommends narrowing the list of representatives designated and authorized to administer the District's LAIF account, providing specificity in the resolution with respect to those authorized, and ensuring the list of authorized representatives is periodically updated with LAIF. The proposed Resolution designates and authorizes the following representatives to administer the District's LAIF account: President, Treasurer, General Manager, Deputy Treasurer, Director of Finance and Administration, Finance Manager, and Senior Accountant.

The Political Reform Act requires all public agencies, including Las Virgenes Municipal Water District (District), to adopt a conflict of interest code. The code designates positions required to file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700) and assigns disclosure categories specifying the types of interests to be reported. Public agencies are required to conduct biennial reviews of their conflict of interest codes and process any necessary amendments in accordance with Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) regulations.

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for the District's conflict of interest code. Staff completed the review of the code and identified one required change involving revision of the title for an existing position. The Board of Supervisors approved the revision to the code, and staff recommends adoption of the amended Conflict of Interest Code.

Section 1. Purpose.

This resolution amends the Administrative Code to incorporate changes to the conflict of interest code as requested by the code reviewing body.

Section 2. Amendment.

Section 2-5.201 of Resolution No. 2468 (Administrative Code) is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"2-5.201 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST CODE DISCLOSURE

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 8100, *et seq.*) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated into the conflict of interest code of this agency by references. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibits) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict of interest code of this agency. All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Board of Directors and General Manager and forward the originals of such statements to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008)."

Section 3. Amendment.

Section 2-5.202 of Resolution No. 2468 (Administrative Code) is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"2-5.202 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST: DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Exhibit "A"

The following categories are established for the purpose of conflicts of interest disclosure:

<u>Category 1</u>. Persons in this category shall disclose all interest in real property within the jurisdiction. Real property shall be deemed to be within the jurisdiction if the property or any part of it is located within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned or used by the agency.

Persons are not required to disclose a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence; however, a residence in which a

person rents out a room or for which a person claims a business deduction may be reportable.

<u>Category 2</u>. Persons in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions.

<u>Category 3</u>. Persons in this category shall disclose all income (including gifts, loans, and travel payments) and business positions.

<u>Category 4</u>. Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, investments in, or income (including gifts, loans, and travel payments) received from business entities that manufacture, provide or sell service and/or supplies of a type utilized by the agency and associated with the job assignment of designated positions assigned this disclosure category.

<u>Category 5</u>. Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interest in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individuals who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information, advice, recommendation, or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interest shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act's exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the General Manager or his or her designee of the agency. (See Footnote in Exhibit "B" for clarification.)"

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Section 4. Amendment.

All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Board of Directors and General Manager and forward the originals of such statements to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.Individuals holding designated positions shall file statements of economic interests with the District's filing office. Within five days of receipt of the statements for the members of the Board of Directors, the District shall make and retain copies and forward the originals of these statements to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. Statements for all other designated individuals will be retained by the District.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008)."

Section 3. Amendment.

SUBJECT

Approval of Conflict of Interest Codes.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Approve the Conflict of Interest Codes for the ABC Unified School District; Altadena Library District; Antelope Valley Healthcare District; Charter Oak Unified School District; Child Support Services Department; Glendale Unified School District; Lancaster School District; Las Virgenes Municipal Water District; Probation Department; West Valley County Water District; and Whittier Union High School District, to be effective the day following your Board's approval.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every local government agency must adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code. Agencies are required to amend their Conflict of Interest Codes when necessitated by changed circumstances pursuant to Government Code Section 87306.

In accordance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, the Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for Los Angeles County. The Board of Supervisors must approve an agency's code before it can take effect.

The proposed Conflict of Interest Codes have been thoroughly reviewed and approved by the code

review staff in accordance with the procedures established by your Board.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Approval of the attached codes broadly supports the County Strategic Goal of Operational Effectiveness/Fiscal Sustainability.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Local governmental agencies must have a Conflict of Interest Code in which individuals in designated positions are required to disclose financial interests at a level appropriate to their decision-making authority.

Adoption of a Conflict of Interest Code deters potential conflicts of interest, thereby averting misuse of public funds.

The recommended action has no effect on budget revenues and expenditures.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, the code review staff recommends that your Board approve the Conflict of Interest Codes for the agencies listed below.

Incorporation of FPPC Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) by Reference

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, *et seq.*) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated into the conflict of interest code of this agency by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibits) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict of interest code of this agency.

Place of Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Board of Directors and General Manager and forward the originals of such statements to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

EXHIBIT "A"

CATEGORY 1

Persons in this category shall disclose all interest in real property within the jurisdiction. Real property shall be deemed to be within the jurisdiction if the property or any part of it is located within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned or used by the agency.

Persons are not required to disclose a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence; however, a residence in which a person rents out a room or for which a person claims a business deduction may be reportable.

CATEGORY 2

Persons in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions.

CATEGORY 3

Persons in this category shall disclose all income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) and business positions.

CATEGORY 4

Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, investments in, or income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) received from business entities that manufacture, provide or sell service and/or supplies of a type utilized by the agency and associated with the job assignment of designated positions assigned this disclosure category.

CATEGORY 5

Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interest in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individual who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information advice, recommendation or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interest shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act's exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the General Manager or his or her designee of the agency. (See footnote in Exhibit "B" for clarification.)







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Drought Update Monday, January 9, 2017

KEY ACTION ITEMS FROM THIS MONTH

• State Water Project Allocation Estimate Increased to 45%: On December 21, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) <u>announced</u> an increase in its estimate of 2017's State Water Project (SWP) allocation to 45%, up from the initial estimate of 20%, thanks to December storms making a impression in the drought.

DWR reports that the SWP's principal reservoir, Lake Oroville, held 1.8 million acre-feet on December 21 which is 88% of its historical average to date. Lake Shasta, the Federal Central Valley Project's largest reservoir was holding 3.3 million acre-feet, 120% of its historical average. San Luis Reservoir a critical south-of-Delta storage facility for both the SWP and CVP held 1.2 million acre-feet, 87% of its historical average to date.

For more information DWR's California Data Exchange Center websites show current water conditions for <u>Reservoirs</u> and <u>Precipitation</u>.

• State and Federal Officials Release Final Environmental Documents for Cal WaterFix: On December 22, state and federal officials released the final, refined <u>environmental documents</u> for the <u>California Water Fix</u> an effort to modernize the state's water infrastructure in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The project's lead agencies, the California Department of Water Resources and U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, identified WaterFix as the preferred alternative to modernize California's primary water delivery system in the Delta.

DWR officials indicate that <u>WaterFix</u> will secure water supplies for 25 million Californians and prepare for a future marked by rising seas, seismic threats and more extreme weather. The <u>project</u> consists of three new intakes in the northern Delta and two 35-mile-long tunnels to transport water to the existing pumping plants in the south Delta. New intakes and tunnels also would help guard water supplies against saltwater intrusion as sea levels rise and in the event of an earthquake or storm powerful enough to destroy levees in the low-lying Delta.

• **President Signs WIIN Act:** On December 16, President Barack Obama <u>signed</u> the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (<u>WIIN</u>). The WIIN Act includes restoration of the Los Angeles River, Lake Tahoe, and the Salton Sea, as well as help capture ground water. The legislation would improve the drought mitigation projects, and also promote local water supply development. It would also authorize \$558 million for new water infrastructure in the West, including \$515 million for storage, water recycling and reuse, and desalination projects in <u>California</u>. • California's Water Conservation Education Program Campaign: In December, Save Our Water continues to promote the <u>#reimagineyourlandscape</u> statewide marketing efforts through weather and traffic sponsorships, radio and gas pump ads, billboards, and social media clips to encourage Californians to conserve water with California-friendly yards. In addition, Save Our Water shared several articles from its' partner, <u>Plant California</u>, including <u>Waterwise Grasses and Ground Cover</u> and <u>Convert Your Patio to Drip Irrigation</u> on social media.

Save Our Water also continues to promote the "<u>Real People, Real Savings</u>" campaign, which showcases California homeowners and their water-wise gardens and yards, as well as easy outdoor tips to reduce water use. To share your reimagined landscape story, visit the Save Our Water <u>Around the Neighborhood</u> website.

Save Our Water is the state's official water conservation program managed in partnership between the Association of California Water Agencies and the Department of Water Resources. For more tips and tools to help conserve water, learn about rebates on turf and toilet replacement, relevant water and drought news, and keep trees healthy during the drought, please visit the new SaveOurWater.com, available in both English and Spanish, or connect with the program on Facebook, Twitter, or Instagram.

• **Governor's Drought Task Force:** The Task Force continues to take actions that conserve water and coordinate state response to the drought. During the December 12 meeting, the Task Force provided updates on water operations and environmental habitat, water conservation, and drought impacts and response efforts. In addition, the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) provided an update to the state tree mortality issue and indicated that federal, state, local, and utility partners continue to coordinate and remove dead and dying trees that pose the greatest risk to public safety.

To date, CAL FIRE and its partners have removed more than 423,000 trees in 10 counties, inspected and cleared dead trees along nearly 52,000 miles of roads and power lines, created approximately 1,300 acres of fuel breaks, and treated more than 26,000 acres.

CURRENT DROUGHT CONDITIONS

- Weather Outlook: As rain returns to the North Bay this evening and then to our entire region on Tuesday as another system moves through. Rain will change over to showers on Wednesday with drier weather likely by the end of the week. A prolonged period of heavy snow is expected in the northern Sierra. Stormy conditions will also result in gusty ridgetop winds and mountain snow across northwest California. A fast moving cold front will bring a period of moderate to heavy rain to portions of southwest California this morning. Additional widespread rainfall is likely with a cooler system late Tuesday into Wednesday. More rain is possible later in the week with continued cool conditions.
- Recent Precipitation: In the past week, widespread precipitation occurred across the entire forecast region. North Coast Hydrologic Region received up to 5 inches of precipitation. San Francisco Region, Central Coast Region, and South Coast region received up to 4 inches, 7 inches, and 2.5 inches of precipitation, respectively. Northern Sierra received up to 8 inches of precipitation. Parts of the San Joaquin Valley and the Inland South Coast region had the least precipitation ranging from half an inch to tenths of inches. - Reservoir Management: Since the last report on December 30, Central Valley reservoirs from Shasta and Trinity in the North to Isabella in the South had a net gain in storage of 361,309 acrefeet, with total gains being 380,004 acre-feet and total losses being 18,695 acre-feet. Shasta Reservoir increased by 32,958 acre-feet, while San Luis Reservoir, an off-stream reservoir for the Central Valley Project and State Water Project, increased its storage by 56,755 acre-feet.

As of midnight on January 5th, Shasta, Oroville, and Folsom Reservoirs recorded 3,378,190 AF, 2,041,007 AF, and 461,754 AF, storage respectively. The 10-day average changes were 3,445, 8,960, and -11,559 AF/day, respectively.

- Reservoir Levels as of January 8 have remained steady, including: Castaic Lake 60% of capacity (75% of year to date average); Don Pedro 80% of capacity (120% of average); Folsom Lake 51% of capacity (104% of average); Lake McClure 53% of capacity (118% of average); Lake Oroville 64% of capacity (102% of average); Lake Perris 37% (47% of average); Millerton Lake 74% of capacity (134% of average); New Melones 29% of capacity (51% of average); Pine Flat 36% of capacity (84% of average); San Luis 66% of capacity (93% of average); Shasta 76% of capacity (120% of average); and Trinity Lake 53% of capacity (78% of average). An update of water levels at other smaller reservoirs is available.
- Dry Well Reports: California's Water Year 2015-16 ended on September 30 with lower-thanexpected rainfall and a "snow drought" as the state's snowpack measured well-below average. As the state enters a new water year, the Governor's Drought Task Force continues to monitor and identify communities and local water systems in danger of running out of water. The crossagency team, led by the Department of Water Resources (DWR), continues to improve and streamline data collection and reporting for household water shortages for California water systems with fewer than 15 household connections.

As of December 12, approximately 2,357 wells statewide have been identified as critical or dry. affecting over 12,785 residents. Cal OES reported that 2,169 of the 2,357 dry wells are concentrated in the inland regions within the Central Valley. For Californians experiencing a water supply shortage, residents can submit a report on DWR's Household Water Supply Shortage Reporting System website.

Vulnerable Water Systems: The State Water Board continues to provide technical and funding assistance to several communities facing drinking water shortages, and is monitoring water systems across the state. The Budget Act of 2016, SB 826, appropriated \$15 million from the

Cleanup and Abatement Account Interim Emergency Drinking Water Program (CAA) for addressing drought-related drinking water emergencies or threatened emergencies. Since July 2016, 7 projects have been approved to receive CAA SB 826: 0 of 5 approved funding agreements have been executed, and 2 oral agreements have been issued. To date, the State Water Board has received requests for \$1.4 million of those funds.

On July 19, 2016, the State Water Board approved the allocation of up to \$4 million from the CAA SB 826 funding program to provide interim emergency drinking water to disadvantaged communities with a contaminated water supply. Since July 2016, 17 projects have been approved to receiving emergency funding for interim drinking water, 1 of 10 funding agreements have been executed, and 7 oral agreements have been issued. To date, the State Water Board has received requests for \$1.3 million of those funds.

- Fire Activity: Since the beginning of the year, firefighters from CAL FIRE, U.S. Forest Service and other federal fire agencies have responded to over 6,986 wildfires across the state, burning 564,835 acres. Fire activity across California is high resulting in 5 new wildfires over the past week.
- CAL FIRE Burn Suspension Status: The recent rains and lowered fire threat has allowed CAL FIRE to lift the outdoor open residential burn restriction across much of the State. Currently, the following counties are required to obtain burn permits including: Alpine, Amador, Eastern Trinity, El Dorado, Fresno, Inyo, Imperial, Kings, Mono, Monterey, Nevada, Placer, Riverside, San Benito, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Sierra, Tulare, and Yuba counties.

Homeowners should always check with their local CAL FIRE station and local air quality management agency before burning. CAL FIRE Burn Permits are required in most Counties until further notice. Agriculture burns must be inspected by CAL FIRE prior to burning. For additional information on preparing for and preventing wildfires visit <u>www.ReadyForWildfire.org</u>.

ONGOING DROUGHT SUPPORT

• Emergency Food Aid, Utility and Employment Assistance: The Department of Social Services (CDSS) Drought Food Assistance Program (DFAP) provides food assistance to affected communities that suffer high levels of unemployment from the drought. To date, over 1,862,846 boxes have been provided to community food banks in drought-impacted counties. Approximately 1,697,253 boxes of food have been picked up by 879,273 households.

Food boxes distributions vary by county and occur 1-4 times per month. This past week, nearly 41% of the food distributions have occurred in the Tulare Basin (Fresno, Kern, Kings and Tulare). An estimated 12,240 boxes are scheduled for delivery to Fresno, Kern, Merced, Riverside, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tulare the week ending January 6.

The Labor Workforce Development Agency reported that the federally funded Drought Temporary Jobs program has enrolled 1,245 participants at 200 worksite projects in 24 counties. The program is funded through the U.S. Department of Labor's National Dislocated Worker Grant program, which offers 2,080 hours of employment on drought-related public works projects to workers affected by the drought.

The Department of Community Services and Development (CSD), in partnership with the Department of Water Resources, continues to implement the Toilet Retrofit Program, which

administers Proposition 1 funds to install high-efficiency toilets (HETs) in disadvantaged communities throughout the state. The program has administered \$5.3 million to over 30 energy service providers and entities. To date, approximately 6,894 HETs have been installed, which have saved over 16.6 million gallons of water. It is expected that approximately 12,000 HETs will be installed during this program.

In response to California's historic drought, CSD has received an additional \$7.5 million in 2016-17 General Funds to implement the Drought Emergency Assistance Program. This program provides emergency relief and support services to drought-impacted individuals including low-income migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families and households. As of December 9, \$1,790,871 has been issued to 1165 households.

• **Drought Response Funding:** The \$3.7 billion in state drought funding appropriated in the 2014 and 2015 Budget Acts, as well as in March 2015 through emergency legislation, continues to advance toward meeting critical near-term needs and long-term drought resiliency and water supply needs.

In June 2016, Governor Brown <u>approved</u> an additional \$254.7 million for the 2016-17 budget to continue the state's response to the drought. These additional funds will be available to aid in emergency drinking water for communities, emergency food assistance, enhanced fire protection, environmental and wildlife assistance, assistance to communities to help dispose of the dead and dying trees in high hazard zones for public safety issues, and the continued statewide awareness campaign.

 Water Agency Conservation Efforts: Last year, the Association of California Water Agencies (<u>AWCA</u>) launched an interactive gallery to showcase the local drought response activities by ACWA members statewide. As the drought stretches into its fifth year in 2016, the <u>Drought Response Gallery</u> continues to highlight conservation and efficiency projects and program actions in five categories.

In June 2016, ACWA <u>released</u> a Water Conservation Communications Toolkit to assist water agencies in messaging to customers the transition to a new emergency conservation regulation and the importance of ongoing water conservation.

• **County and Tribal Drought Task Forces:** A total of 19 county and tribal drought task forces continue to coordinate local drought response in 2016. Inland regions counties include: Butte, Colusa, Madera, Merced, Modoc, San Joaquin, Siskiyou, Tehama, Tulare, and Tuolumne. Coastal regions counties include: Hoopa Valley Tribe (Humboldt County), Humboldt, Karuk Tribe (Siskiyou County), San Mateo, Trinidad Tribe (Humboldt County), and Yurok Tribe (Humboldt and Del Norte County). Southern regions counties include: Orange, San Luis Obispo, and Santa Barbara.

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Rules and Regulations for Region 8

Each region shall organize and adopt rules and regulations for the conduct of its meetings and affairs not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation or bylaws of the Association (ACWA Bylaw V, 6.).

Officers

At least one of the chair or vice chair positions must be an elected / appointed director from a member agency.

The term of the chair and the vice chair shall allow for two successive two-year terms allowing a maximum of four consecutive years as chair or vice chair.

The chair will appoint a secretary if one is deemed necessary.

Meetings

The Region 8 board shall approve all region programs and activities.

Region 8 shall have a general membership meeting annually in addition to those meetings at the ACWA conferences.

Attendance

If a region chair or vice chair is no longer allowed to serve on the Board of Directors due to his / her attendance, the region board shall appoint from the existing region board a new region officer. (ACWA Policy & Guideline Q, 1.)

If a region chair or vice chair misses three consecutive region board / membership meetings, the same process shall be used to backfill the region officer position. (ACWA Policy & Guideline Q, 1.)

If a region board member has three consecutive unexcused absences from a region board meeting or general membership business meeting, the region board will convene to discuss options for removal of the inactive board member. If the vacancy causes the board to fail to meet the minimum requirement of five board members, the region must fill the vacancy according to its rules and regulations. (ACWA Policy & Guideline Q, 3.)

Elections

All nominations received for the region chair, vice chair and board positions must be accompanied by a resolution of support from each sponsoring member agency, signed by an authorized representative of the Board of Directors. Only one individual may be nominated from a given agency to run for election to a region board. Agencies with representatives serving on the nominating committees should strive not to submit nominations for the region board from their agency. (ACWA Policy & Guideline P, 2.)

Election ballots will be e-mailed to ACWA member agency general managers and presidents.

The nominating committee shall consist of three to five members.

The nominating committee shall pursue qualified members within the region to run for the region board; consider geographic diversity, agency size and focus in selecting a slate, nominate both elected/appointed officials and staff members as part of the Region 8 board; and preserve objectivity by not nominating a member of the nominating committee for any elected positions being considered.

See the current region election timeline for specific dates

Endorsements

ACWA, as a statewide organization, may endorse potential nominees and nominees for appointment to local, regional, and statewide commissions and boards. ACWA's regions may submit a recommendation for consideration and action to the ACWA Board of Directors to endorse a potential nominee or nominee for appointment to a local, regional or statewide commission or board. (ACWA Policy & Guideline P, 3.)

Committee Recommendations & Representation

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All regions are given equal opportunity to recommend representatives of the region for appointment to a standing or regular committee of the Association. If a region fails to provide full representation on all ACWA committees, those committee slots will be left open for the remainder of the term or until such time as the region designates a representative to complete the remainder of the term. (ACWA Policy & Guideline P, 4. A.)

At the first region board / membership meeting of the term, regions shall designate a representative serving on each of the standing and regular committees to serve as the official reporter to and from the committee on behalf of the region to facilitate input and communication. (ACWA Policy & Guideline P, 4. B.)

The chair and vice chair shall make all committee appointment recommendations to the ACWA committees, to be ratified by the Region 8 board prior to submission to the ACWA president for consideration.

Tours

ACWA may develop and conduct various tours for the regions. All tour attendees must sign a "release and waiver" to attend any and all region tours. Attendees agree to follow environmental guidelines and regulations in accordance with direction from ACWA staff; and will respect the rights and privacy of other attendees. (ACWA Policy & Guideline P, 6.)

Finances

See "Financial Guidelines for ACWA Region Events" document.

Amending the Region Rules & Regulations

ACWA policies and guidelines can be amended by approval of the ACWA Board of Directors.

The Region 8 Rules & Regulations can be amended by a majority vote of those present at any Region 8 meeting as long as a quorum is present.

SUMMARY:

On November 8, 2016, the Board awarded a design contract to Cannon Corporation, in the amount of \$58,114, for the preparation of plans, specifications, and environmental analyses to replace a deteriorated 8-inch asbestos cement water main along Jed Smith Road, between Round Meadow Road and Lewis and Clark Road, in the City of Hidden Hills. At the meeting, the Board appropriated \$70,000 for the design and preparation of the plans and specifications. The design work was completed, and staff recommends the issuance of a Call for bids for the construction of the project.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Find that the work is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act and approve the issuance of a Call for Bids for the Jed Smith Pipeline Replacement Project.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact associated with a Call for Bids. The Engineer's Estimate for the project is \$556,400. At the time of construction award, an additional appropriation will be requested to fund the cost of construction.

DISCUSSION:

On August 24, 2016, staff responded to an 8-inch water main break near 5403 Jed Smith Road in the City of Hidden Hills. Staff repaired the asbestos cement water main and restored water service within eight hours. The break marked the seventh failure that had occurred along the pipeline since 1995. Based on an inspection of the failed pipe section, a review of record drawings and an evaluation of prior main breaks in the area, staff concluded that approximately 1,850 feet of 8-inch asbestos cement water main along Jed Smith Road, between Round Meadow Road and Lewis and Clark Road, had reached the end of its service life and required replacement. The 2014 Potable Water Master Plan Update identified the need to increase the size of the water main from 8-inch to 10-inch to meet future demands.

The proposed project consists of removing the above-mentioned section of 8-inch asbestos cement pipe and replacing it with a 10-inch PVC pipe. The laterals and services will be re-established, and the new pipeline will be located within the asphalt roadway, as opposed to the parkway as it exists today. By shifting the pipeline location to the roadway, the project will be more economical and have less impact on residents, shortening the amount of time without water and eliminating the need to bore under or remove and replace numerous, decorative driveway aprons that cross the existing line.

The Engineer's Estimate for construction is \$556,400. An additional appropriation will be requested once the bids have been submitted, and the project is ready for award of a construction contract.

The work is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to Section 15301(b) and (d) of the CEQA Guidelines because it involves only minor alterations to an existing facility with negligible expansion of an existing use. Attached is a Notice of Exemption that staff proposes to complete and file, pending Board approval of the CEQA determination.

SUMMARY:

On November 22, 2016, the Board authorized a call for bids for the Las Virgenes Road Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 Rehabilitation Project to rehabilitate a pressure reducing station located in an underground vault west of Las Virgenes Road, near the District's Headquarters. A mandatory pre-bid walk was conducted on December 14, 2016. Five bids were submitted and publicly opened on January 4, 2017. Staff evaluated the bids and determined that the lowest responsive bid was submitted by J. Vega Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$67,450, which is approximately 21% lower than the Engineer's Estimate.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Award a construction contract to J. Vega Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$67,450, and reject all remaining bids upon receipt of duly executed contract documents for the Las Virgenes Road Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 Rehabilitation Project.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Sufficient funding is available in the adopted Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget under CIP Job No. 10632. No additional appropriation is required.

DISCUSSION:

Pressure Reducing Station No. 49 on Las Virgenes Road has reached the end of its useful life and requires rehabilitation that involves replacing the valves and fittings within the vault and reestablishing the connection with the existing inlet pipes by excavating adjacent to the vault.

The facility is an underground pressure reducing station located within a landscaped area of the Malibu Canyon Villas Homeowners Association at 4265 Las Virgenes Road. The station reduces pressure from the 1235-foot zone to the 1000-foot zone and was constructed in 1985 as part of the housing tract. The valves and fittings have deteriorated with excessive corrosion due to the damp conditions in the vault. Given the location of the station and close proximity to homes, staff determined that it would not be feasible to reconstruct the station above ground for aesthetic reasons. To reduce the potential for future corrosion of the metallic components within the vault, the new pipe, fittings and valves will be fusion-bonded, epoxy-lined and coated, which will extend the life of the new station with greater corrosion protection.

The Engineer's Estimate for the construction work was \$85,000. The summary of bids is as follows:

SUMMARY:

On November 22, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2502, regarding the District's intent to continue the Water Replacement Fund Standby Charge pursuant to the Municipal Water District Law of 1911. On January 10, 2017, a public hearing was conducted for the proposed Ordinance as it relates to continuation of the Standby Charge for Fiscal Year 2017-18, and the proposed Ordinance was given first reading by title only. At this time, staff recommends that the Board adopt the Ordinance.

Waive the full reading of proposed Ordinance No. 279 as it relates to continuation of the Water Replacement Fund Standby Charge for Fiscal Year 2017-18; give second reading of the Ordinance by title only; approve the rules and regulations for Water Standby Charge Deferrals; pass, approve and adopt the Ordinance as presented; and order publication within 15 days of adoption using a summary of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 279

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AS RELATES TO STANDBY CHARGES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2017

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

Section 1. Purpose

This ordinance fixes and continues a standby charge to be levied against each lot or parcel within the district for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2017, for the purpose of financing the district's potable water replacement program. This charge is imposed pursuant to the Municipal Water District Law.

Section 2. Findings

The Board of Directors finds, determines and declares as follows:

(a) The board has provided a duly published and mailed notice of public hearing and has conducted a public hearing to consider adoption of a standby assessment;

(b) The board has considered the written and oral comments presented by interested parties concerning the assessment;

(c) The district has approved a categorical exemption for the project under the California Environmental Quality Act because the charges are not designed to increase or expand services;

(d) The standby assessment will be used to pay for a portion of the cost of the potable water replacement programs instituted by the district;

(e) It is in the best interests of the district and the community which it serves to pay for a portion of water programs from the proceeds of standby assessments because landowners benefit from maintaining available water supply.

Section 3. Standby Charge

An annual standby charge in the amount of \$10.00 per acre for parcels over one acre, and \$10.00 for each parcel of land of less than one acre is hereby levied against all land within the district for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2017. A description of the lands (by assessor parcel number) affected by the assessment is on file with the secretary.

Section 4. Collection

The Board of Supervisors and Auditor of the County of Los Angeles are hereby directed to levy, collect and remit to the district this standby charge at the time and in the manner required by law for the levying of taxes for county purposes.

Section 5. Deferrals

(a) A property owner may request a complete or partial deferral from the standby charge by filing a written request by April 13th, 2017 during the fiscal year for which the deferral is sought. The deferral shall be processed and evaluated in accordance with this section.

(b) The following property is eligible for deferral:

- (i) Property owned and occupied by a federal, state or local governmental agency.
- (ii) Property permanently dedicated to open-space.

(iii) Property which cannot use water supplied by the district due to restrictions imposed by deed or governmental agencies with land use jurisdiction.

(iv) Property which cannot reasonably be expected to derive any benefit from facilities constructed with the proceeds of the water standby charge.

(c) If the general manager approves the request, the charges paid by the applicant shall be refunded and no charge shall be levied for subsequent years. The applicant shall execute an agreement to repay the charges with interest if the property ceases to be eligible for the deferral. The agreement shall be recorded.

(d) If the general manager denies the request, the applicant may appeal denial of the deferral by the general manager by filing a written request for review within 10-days after the general manager's decision. The board shall promptly consider the request for review. The decision of the board shall be final.

(e) The general manager shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations to implement this section.
